General Information

Founded in 1945, Kaiser Permanente is America's leading integrated health plan. The Kaiser Permanente East Bay Area consists of two medical centers with associated hospitals and medical offices in Oakland and Richmond, and satellite medical offices in Alameda and Pinole. Here, we proudly serve a diverse population of over 300,000 patients. Located in beautiful Oakland, CA, the Kaiser Permanente Oakland Medical Center (OMC) is the flagship for Kaiser Foundation Hospitals and houses a 349-bed tertiary care teaching hospital. The new State of the Art Kaiser Oakland Medical Center opened in July 2014. We also opened the first ever farmer's market and health food store on-site that continues to be successful.

The East Bay Department of Pharmacy provides services in the acute care, outpatient, home health, ambulatory care, drug education, and administration settings. Inpatient and outpatient pharmaceutical care services are provided 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Pharmacists participate in a wide range of clinical activities. In the ambulatory care setting, we provide services in anticoagulation, primary care, asthma, osteoporosis, hospice and oncology as well as in drug use management and drug education. In the acute care setting, we provide services in pediatrics, infectious diseases, critical care, pain, and palliative care. Our service area provides many outstanding opportunities for pharmacists to practice in collaboration with physicians, nurses, and other professionals under an integrated healthcare model. In addition, we have state of the art technology including CPOE, eMAR, bedside barcoding, and electronic medical record (EMR) program that integrates both acute care and ambulatory care settings.

The Kaiser Oakland Leukemia and Lymphoma department is a center of excellence for the Kaiser Northern California region and receives referrals for management of complex hematology patients.

Residency Specific Information

PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care or other advanced practice settings. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency are prepared for advanced patient care, academic, or other specialized positions, along with board certification, if available.

In addition, resident will be able:

- To further develop and elevate expertise on pharmacotherapy in oncology and hematology specialties in both inpatient and outpatient settings
- To become an integral part of the multidisciplinary team providing evidence based therapy to optimize outcomes
- To teach/precept pharmacy students, PGY-1 pharmacy residents, other healthcare providers
- To advance medication utilization process
- To participate in research and quality improvement efforts
- To promote professional development and expansion of clinical pharmacy service in oncology and hematology

- To participate in clinical and economic clinical analysis.

Resident responsibilities:

- Promote expansion of clinical oncology pharmacy services
- Publication of research projects as well as other clinical findings

Residency Project

The resident will develop and complete a longitudinal research project guided by highly qualified preceptors and will present the findings at the Hematology/Oncology Pharmacy Association (HOPA) Conference and American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO).

Professional Development

The resident will attend at least one professional conference that may include: California Society of Health System Pharmacists (CSHP), HOPA, and ASCO.

Salary and Benefits

Kaiser Permanente East Bay Area has ONE position available in the Post Graduate Year Two (PGY2) Pharmacy Residency Program. The compensation for the one year, non-exempt position is approximately \$33.70 per hour. The residency will begin tentatively first week of July. Benefits include ten (10) days of paid-time-off (PTO), health benefits including dental and optical, and funding for pre-approved conferences. Kaiser Permanente is an Equal Opportunity Employer.

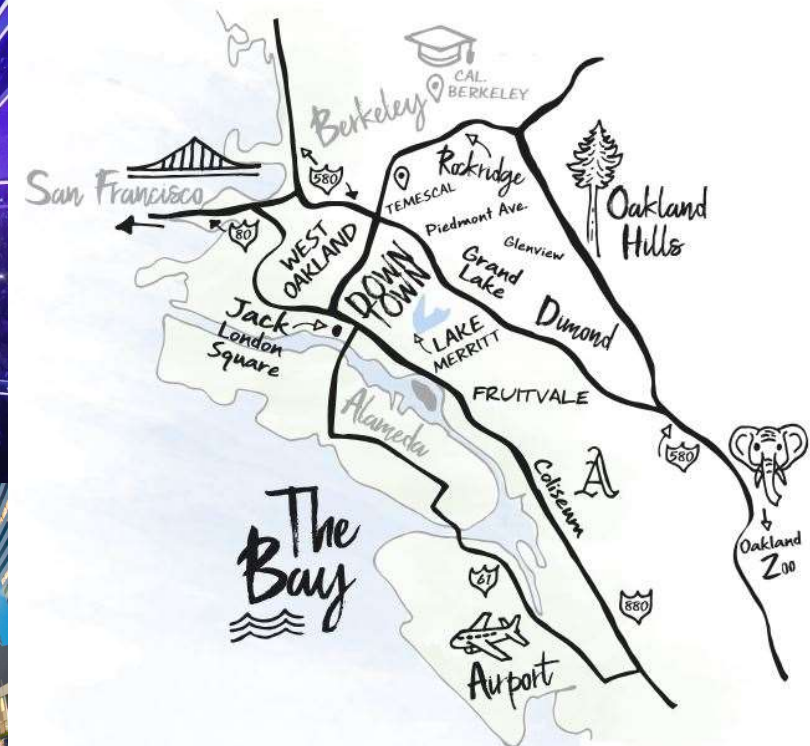
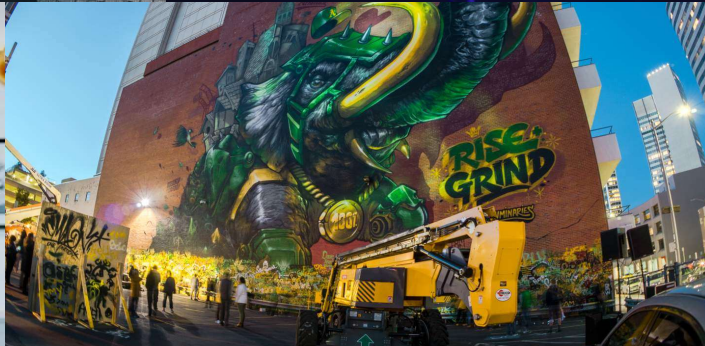
