Post Graduate Year Two (PGY2) Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency Program at a Glance

Overview

The purpose of the PGY2 pharmacy residency program is to build on the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experiences and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care or other advanced practice settings. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency are prepared for advanced patient care, academic, or other specialized positions, along with board certification.

The Kaiser Permanente San Jose PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency Program provides a comprehensive learning experience in a variety of areas related to mental health. Training experiences include rotations in the inpatient and ambulatory Care settings. In addition to working closely with preceptors, physicians, and patients to become an integral part of the psychiatric care team, the psychiatric pharmacy resident will work closely with psychiatric medical residents; coupling together as a team during specific psychiatry rotations to enhance the depth of the pharmaceutical and the didactic learning experience.

Qualification Requirements

All applicants must meet the following criteria to qualify for acceptance as a Kaiser San Jose Pharmacy Resident:

- Graduate of an ACPE accredited college or school of pharmacy or equivalent
- Completion of an ASHP-Accredited PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program prior to start date or have equivalent experience approved by ASHP.
- Licensed as a pharmacist in the state of CA or licensed as an Intern Pharmacist in the state of CA by start of program.
- Must be licensed as a pharmacist in the state of CA by August 1, 2022.

Application Process:

 - 1. Application / Letter of intent
 - 2. Curriculum Vitae
 - 3. Three letters of recommendations in the PHORCAS application (1 from PGY1 Residency Director)
 - 4. Official copy of a college transcript sent directly from the applicant's school of pharmacy to PHORCAS (Show graduation date)
 - 5. Submission of application by due date as indicated on PHORCAS (Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application Service: https://portal.phorcas.org/)

Salary and Benefits:

- Kaiser Permanente San Jose Medical Center has 2 positions available in the PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency Program.
- The twelve-month long PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency will begin approximately on July 3, 2023 and run through approximately June 28, 2024.
- Stipend: \$33.70/hr, payroll is every 2 weeks (~\$70,000 annually)
