- Must be an active and in goodstanding licensed pharmacist in the state of California or be able to obtain the license on or before October 1st of the residency year.

## **Program Description**

This PGY2 residency provides residents with extensive training and work experience that contributes to their overall development as pharmacists and leaders in the field of medication safety, evidence-based medicine, and policy management. The resident will be an integral member of the Kaiser Permanente Northern California Pharmacy Quality and Medication Safety (PQMS) Team and work in collaboration with other regional pharmacy departments. Activities will include ongoing identification and implementation of best practices, participation in multidisciplinary workgroups or committees, review of High Alert Medication Programs (HAMP), development of medication safety-related drug policies, analysis of medicationrelated errors and adverse events, and development of risk reduction strategies.

The resident will also be involved in efforts to promote a culture of safety and be given opportunities to provide educational training, present a formal lecture at a local school of pharmacy, and precept learning experiences for interns, pharmacy students and PGY1 residents.
