- This twelve-month Postgraduate Year Two (PGY2) pharmacy residency program in Ambulatory Care offers a unique opportunity to develop expertise in a variety of pharmacy practice areas within Kaiser Permanente.

Purpose

PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care or other advanced practice settings. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency are prepared for advanced patient care, academic, or other specialized positions, along with board certification, if available.

The Kaiser Foundation Health Plan of the Mid-Atlantic States Post Graduate Year Two (PGY2) Ambulatory Care residency program focuses on ambulatory care within an integrated health care system. During the residency program, residents will hone their leadership, clinical, and academic skills and cultivate a philosophy of practice that embraces being responsible to their patients, their fellow healthcare providers, the organization and the public for optimal drug therapy outcomes. Graduates of this program will be well prepared to practice as a clinical pharmacy specialist across a variety of ambulatory care settings.

- One written reflection answering each of the following questions in 200 words or less:
 - Describe one of your most recent interventions or contributions on rotation, and what you learned from the experience.
 - Describe what experience(s) led you to pursuing a career in ambulatory care? (either personal or professional)
- Application to the National Matching Service

- Pharmacy licensure required in Maryland and Virginia for all Residents. Primary licensure is required within 3 weeks of the residency start date and licensure in the alternate location, either Maryland or Virginia, is required within 90 days of the start date. DC licensure is strongly encouraged.

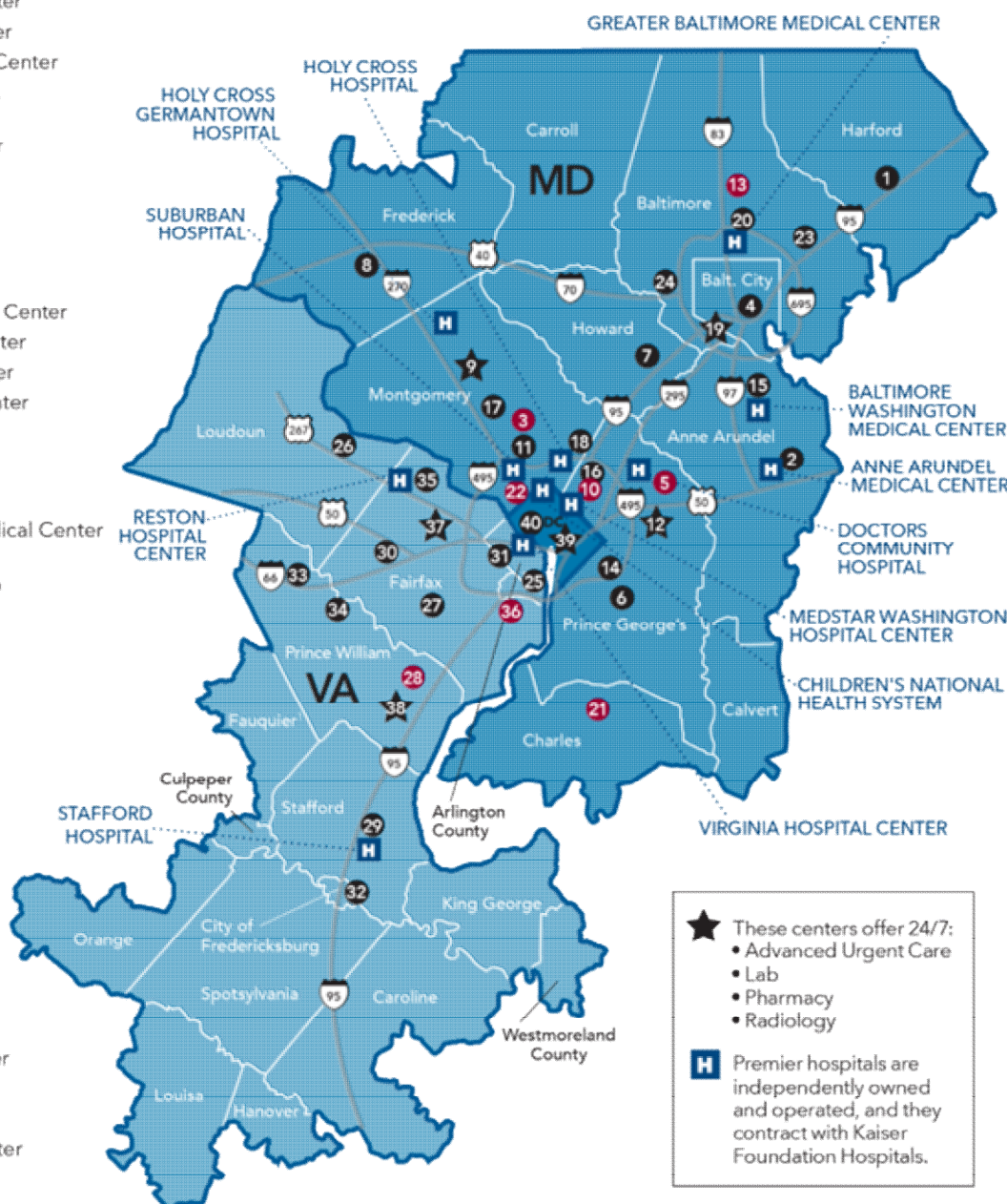
