

Residency Qualifications

- Must have completed an ASHP-accredited or candidate-status PGY1 residency prior to start of program.
- Must be licensed as an intern pharmacist in the state of California by the first day of residency program if not already licensed as a pharmacist in California.
- Must be a licensed California pharmacist within 120 days from the program start date. Residents who are not licensed as a pharmacist within 120 days from the program start date will have their term of appointment extended by the number of days the resident is without licensure past the 120-day deadline up to a maximum of 45 days. Failure to obtain a California state pharmacist license within 165 days from the program start date will result in the resident being dismissed from the program and employment will be terminated.
- To be eligible for pharmacist licensure, candidates must be graduates or candidates for graduation from an ACPE accredited degree program (or one in the process of pursuing accreditation) or have a Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Examination Committee (FPGEC) certificate from the NABP.

Program Description

This PGY2 residency provides residents with extensive training and work experience that contributes to their overall development as pharmacists and leaders in the field of medication safety and policy development. The resident will be an integral member of the Northern California Pharmacy Quality & Medication Safety (PQMS) Team and work in collaboration with other regional and national pharmacy departments.

Activities will include but are not limited to:

- Ongoing participation in multidisciplinary workgroups and committees
- Development and maintenance of medication safety-related drug policies and guidelines
- Analysis of medication events (errors and adverse reactions) for identification and development of risk reduction strategies.
- Involvement in efforts to promote a culture of safety
- Opportunities to provide educational training (e.g., a formal lecture at a local school of pharmacy and precept learning experiences for students and/or PGY1 residents)
