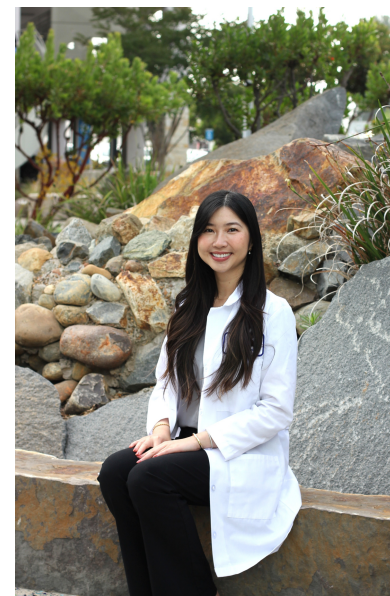
The Pharmacist Resident will be involved with drug therapy management as a member of the care team and exercise skill in educating others regarding hematology and oncology medication management.
