The Kaiser Foundation Health Plan of the Mid-Atlantic States Post Graduate Year One (PGY-1) pharmacy residency program focuses on ambulatory care within an integrated health care system. During the residency program, residents will integrate clinical, administrative and leadership skills and cultivate a philosophy of practice that embraces being responsible to their patients, their fellow healthcare providers, the organization and the public for optimal drug therapy outcomes.

 - Kaiser Permanente Program Code for Maryland/DC/ Virginia - October start date: **149821**
- Pharmacy licensure required in Maryland and Virginia for all Residents. Primary licensure is recommended within 3 weeks of the residency start date and licensure in the alternate location, either Maryland or Virginia, is required within 120 days of the start date.
- A Pharmacy Intern license in Maryland, DC or Virginia is required by the residency start date if you do not already have Pharmacy licensure by the start date.
