

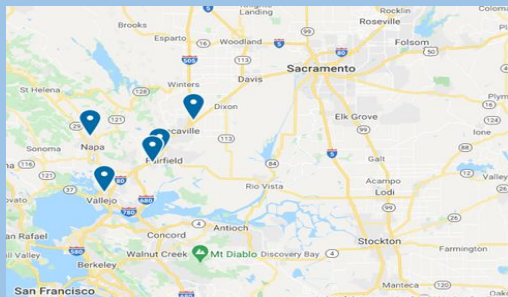

Our Mission

The Kaiser Permanente Napa Solano Residency Program is a 52-week postgraduate program that provides training and experience in the provision of pharmaceutical care and pharmacy practice. The Kaiser Permanente, Napa-Solano Pharmacy Medical Care Residency Program builds on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

Resident Responsibilities

- **Residency Projects:** Each resident will utilize a formal research or project management methodology to develop and implement a residency project. This project will culminate with a presentation of the results at the Western States Regional Residency Conference in San Diego, CA.
- **Continuing Education Seminar Series:** Each resident is required to present a formal education seminar on a topic of their choosing.
- **Pharmacy Operations:** The leadership team at Kaiser Permanente meets regularly with the residents to involve them in the implementation of management programs and ensure exposure to various aspects of pharmacy administration. Additionally, residents are also required to be active participants in the local pharmacy and therapeutics committee and other additional pharmacy committees per discretion of the residency director.
- **Precepting:** Residents are given the opportunity to precept pharmacy students in various rotations.
- **Staffing:** Each resident is required to practice as a pharmacist in a designated area throughout the residency year.
