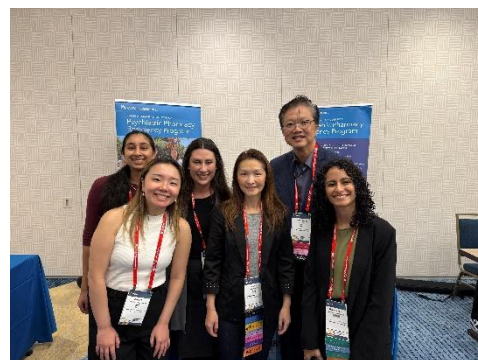


Kaiser Permanente San Jose Medical Center PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency Program

Overview

PGY2 residency programs build upon Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency training to develop pharmacist practitioners with knowledge, skills, and abilities as defined in the educational competency areas, goals, and objectives for advanced practice areas. Residents who successfully complete PGY2 residency programs are prepared for advanced patient care or other specialized positions, and board certification in the advanced practice area, if available.

The Kaiser Permanente San Jose PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency program is an American Society of Health Systems Pharmacists (ASHP) accredited program that offers a variety of opportunities in mental health through comprehensive learning experiences. The program is structured to ensure meaningful progression in the resident's expertise. Initially, residents will work closely with seasoned psychiatric pharmacists to build a robust foundation of knowledge in the field. As the program advances, residents gain increased autonomy to collaborate with psychiatry attendings, psychiatry residents, and medical students. The program's dual exposure to both inpatient and ambulatory care settings equips residents with a versatile and well-rounded skill set, preparing them for future careers across a variety of practice settings.

Qualifications and Application Requirements

All applicants must meet the following criteria to qualify for acceptance as a Kaiser San Jose PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Resident:

- Graduate of an Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) accredited college or school of pharmacy or equivalent
- Completion of an American Society of Health Systems Pharmacists (ASHP)-Accredited PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program prior to the PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency Program start date or have equivalent experience approved by ASHP
- Licensed as a Pharmacist in the state of California or licensed as an Intern Pharmacist in the state of California by the start of the residency program
- Residents must be licensed as a California pharmacist within 120 days of the program's start date. Residents who are not licensed as a pharmacist within 120 days from the program start date will have their term of appointment extended by the number of days the resident is without licensure past the 120-day deadline up to a maximum of 45 days. Failure to obtain a California state pharmacist license within 165 days from the program start date will result in the resident being dismissed from the program and employment will be terminated
- Candidates must be registered in the National Matching Services, Inc. (NMS)
- Candidates must participate in the ASHP Matching Program

Application Process and Deadline

The following documents are required to complete the application process (please visit <https://pharmacyresidency.kaiserpermanente.org/> for more details):

1. Statement of interest / Letter of intent
2. Curriculum Vitae
3. Three letters of recommendations in the PHORCAS application (1 from a PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program Director)
4. Official copy of a college / school transcript sent directly from the applicant's college / school of pharmacy to PHORCAS (showing graduation date on the transcript)
5. Submission of application by due date as indicated on PHORCAS (Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application Service: <https://portal.phorcass.org/>)
6. Program NMS Code: 606166
7. ASHP Program Code: 92956
8. **Application Deadline: January 5th, 2027, at 11:59 pm eastern standard time (EST)**

Salary and Benefits

- Kaiser Permanente San Jose Medical Center has 2 positions available in the PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency Program.
- The 52-week long PGY2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency will begin approximately on June 28, 2027, and run through approximately June 23, 2028
- Pay rate: ~\$46.05/hour, payroll is every 2 weeks (~\$95,784 annually)

- Summary of benefits
